Ash Wednesday and Lent Midweek Services This year our Lenten pilgrimage to Easter's baptismal waters begins with Ash Wednesday worship at 6:30 p.m. on

March 2nd. This service of holy communion includes the invitation to Lent and the imposition of ashes.

Starting on Wednesday, March 9th and continuing through April 6th, we will have soup and sandwich suppers served at 5:30 p.m. and a service of Compline at 6:30 p.m. each Wednesday evening. Compline is a meditative service of psalms, song, and prayer. This time of quiet meditation and prayer can be an oasis for the mind and body, heart and soul, in the wilderness of life as we journey from the dust of our creation to the waters of our new birth.

Lent often begins during the month of February. The final Sunday after Epiphany, Transfiguration Sunday, precedes, the most solemn day of the liturgical year, Ash Wednesday. And with ashen cross and the invitation to the classical disciplines of Lent: prayer, fasting, and giving alms, we begin our pilgrimage to the baptismal waters of Easter.

This year, however, Transfiguration Sunday is not until the fourth Sunday of the month and Ash Wednesday holds off until March 2nd. This gives us three Sundays to hear stories from Luke chapters five and six. In the story from chapter five we hear Luke's account of Jesus calling disciples and a miracle catch of fish that resembles the one in John 21 following the resurrection of Jesus. Then in chapter six we hear two portions from Jesus' Sermon on the Plain. The opening like Matthew's Sermon on the Mount includes a litany of blessings. However, in Luke these are followed by a litany of woes. Our second passage from chapter six includes Jesus' teaching on loving enemies, judgment, and forgiveness.

On these three Sundays we also continue reading from 1 Corinthians. During these weeks we read the earliest written account of Jesus' resurrection that we have in scripture and what it means to proclaim Christ crucified and risen. Keep in mind that Paul wrote his letters to the church in Corinth in the mid 50s while Mark, the earliest of our Gospels, was not written until 70.

These weeks give us ample opportunity to consider our call to leave our fish nets and follow Jesus. Luke tells us that after Peter, James, and John returned to shore, *they left everything and followed him*. On this new adventure, we join them, and the crowds gathered to hear Jesus teach declaring who is blessed in the reign of God and what it means to love and forgive as a follower of Christ. *Blessed are the poor, hungry, and those who weep,* Jesus says. *Love your enemies,* Jesus instructs.

As we center our lives in these stories of Jesus calling us from our fishnets to follow him and fish for people in a life of discipleship where blessings abound on the poor and hungry, we experience anew God's grace that calls us to love in entirely new ways well beyond what we thought possible before Jesus summoned us into this new life.

As I think about Jesus calling us into the life of discipleship and following his teachings, I'm also aware that this happens during *Black History Month* and my hope for this annual focus to be a renewal that continues well past the 28 days of the month and into each day of our lives.

Last year when I came home from work on February 1st there was a package at my door. It was a surprise gift from a dear friend: the book *Four Hundred Souls: A Community History of African American, 1619-2019*, edited by Ibram X. Kendi and Keisha N. Blain. I had read about this book and watched some book promotional interviews with Dr. Kendi so was eager to check it out when it published.

The book is divided into ten sections each covering a forty-year span of time with a different author writing a brief essay on something significant during each five-year period. Each section then concludes with a poem summarizing the themes of that era.

Eighty authors and ten poets then comprise the writing of this volume. And as Dr. Kendi explained in one of his interviews, so much of history is written from the perspective of one man. One man simply cannot tell the story of such a diverse people. The essayists in *Four Hundred Souls* represent a diverse array of professions, geography, and perspectives. I found this to be a creative way to communicate the lived stories that are our history.

I hope this soulful history helps us recognize and dismantle the white supremacy that has persisted for four hundred years too long. Jesus has summoned us to make it so.
