All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit...
Acts 2:4

"Happy Birthday!" Wait, whose birthday is it? Some describe the Day of Pentecost as the "Birthday of the church." On the 50th day after

Jesus' resurrection, the Holy Spirit came upon Jesus' first disciples in wind and flame. The Holy Spirit gave them the ability to speak in other languages so everyone who was in Jerusalem that day – no matter what their native tongue was – could clearly hear that Jesus Christ is alive and that, through Jesus, we are given new life. The Day of Pentecost marks the beginning of the followers of Jesus being called to spread the good news to the ends of the earth. The church was born. Since then, every Christian is called be part of the body of Christ in the world. We put flesh and blood on the presence of Jesus. As the song says, "We are the church."

So... "Happy Birthday" to all (past, presence, and future) who have been part of sharing God's love in the world. Like a birthday party with a theme, there are certain things that help us celebrate the church's birthday. One of the most common things is to *wear red on Pentecost Sunday*. Red represents the Holy Spirit coming upon the disciples as tongues of fire resting on their heads. However, in places such as Britain and Ireland, white is worn to represent the Holy Spirit as a dove (as it did in Jesus' baptism). There are also other traditions associated with Pentecost – such as scattering rose petals to represent the tongues of fire (Italy) and blowing trumpets as the sound of rushing wind (France).

Perhaps you have your own creative way to celebrate that our God comes to us again and again with gifts that help us be who God created us to be. As a congregation, *lets come on June 8th with red on* as the Holy Spirit works to set our hearts on fire to share the love of God.

(By the way, the Day of Pentecost is the 7th Sunday after Easter Sunday. The date for Easter Sunday changes and falls on the first Sunday after the first full moon after the vernal equinox (March 21). The earliest date for Easter Sunday is March 22, and the latest is April 25. "Pentecost" means "fiftieth" in Greek. In Bible times, people counted the day of as the first day. So, 7 weeks (49 days for us) was considered the 50th day. The earliest Pentecost can be is May 10, the latest June 13. The next time Easter and Pentecost Sundays fall on their earliest dates is 2285. I don't expect any of us to see that in our lifetimes. However, if you want to experience the latest possible Sundays, just hang in there until 2038.)



A LETTER FROM REV. LISA KIPP, LWR Director of Congregational Engagement:
