Trinity Tidings



Jesus said, "The kingdom of God is among you." Luke 17:21

In Luke 17, while Jesus was heading to Jerusalem where he would be killed and then raised from the dead, some Pharisees asked him when the kingdom of God was coming. They might have been asking when God was going to kick out the Romans and restore the nation of Israel. But Jesus responded by saying that it was already with them. They were missing the point if they thought that God's kingdom was a place on a map or a far-off dream.

The second and third petitions (requests) of the Lord's Prayer are "Thy kingdom come, thy will be done on earth as it is in heaven."

Martin Luther explained that God's Kingdom comes whenever God gives us the Holy Spirit so that we believe in God and live in God's ways. And God's Will is done whenever God destroys or hinders evil and whenever God strengthens us and keeps us faithful to what God wants of us. Luther describes God's Kingdom as something that happens – it is about what God is doing in the world now. It is not an area on the earth, and it is not only experienced after we die and are in heaven.

When we think of it as Luther described, how strange for the Pharisees to ask Jesus when God's Kingdom was coming? Jesus was bringing, embodying, doing the Kingdom of God right before their eyes. They just didn't see it.

With these petitions, we are asking God to give us the eyes of faith to see Jesus is with us and to give us what we need so that we can be part of what God is doing. If all people were to stop praying for God's Kingdom and God's Will, God would not be turned off and shelved like an unused device. Instead, we pray to ask God to rule in our hearts and in our lives.

Maybe another way to think about it is that we are part of a sports team. Our team is so far ahead that we will win the game, but the game does need to be played to the end. We are asking our coach if we can go out there and play hard too. We don't want to be spectators. We want to be out there, playing with our teammates and following our coach's instructions.

The Kingdom of God is among us in Jesus. May we pray and ask to be part of what God wants for us and the world.

Thank you notes were shared from Adeline Anderson for her 3rd grade Bible and from Pastor Diane for Appreciation Sunday and gifts.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Christian Education/Youth – Diane: Sunday School, Confirmation, Faith Kids Club, OSLC Youth Group, and Senior High Lunches are in full swing. Trinity's Sunday School Christmas Program will be during worship service on December 7, 2025. Next Meeting – Thursday, January 8th at 4:45p.m.

Endowment – Glen: Endowment voted in March to distribute funds for Trinity's share of VBS, campership to Red Willow, Castaway Registration, WELCA Bus tickets to Spring Gathering. At the September meeting, Endowment voted to distribute the rest of 2025 funds as follows: General Fund-\$1,000; Grief Book-\$70; LWR Shipping Donation-\$200; with the remaining (approx. \$4,000) divided equally between Barnes County Food Pantry, VCPS Lunch Program, APOC, and Salvation Army.
