When we cry, "Abba! Father!" it is that very Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are children of God. Romans 8:15b-16

I love to put peanut butter and chicken noodle soup together. Why??? When I was in fourth grade, our elementary school learned about food from other countries. Each classroom prepared a dish, and we sampled one another's. My classroom made a chicken, rice, and peanut dish from somewhere on the other side of the world. My classmates and I helped in the preparation, and our teacher managed to pull it all together and cook it without any of us getting burned or permanently damaged. The best part – it tasted amazing. That's when I started putting peanut butter in my chicken noodle soup.

Nowadays when I say I like those two things together, I get skeptical responses. But online you can find recipes with chicken and peanuts (or peanut butter). It really is a thing.

The Lord's Prayer begins "Our Father, who art in heaven, hallowed be thy name." This short sentence conveys a great deal about God and us. God is like a parent that loves, protects, and guides us. We are God's children, and sisters and brothers with one another. But God is not exactly like an earthly father. God is also holy. ("Hallowed" means "holy.") God is close to us and different from us. God brings together characteristics that we might not think of putting together.

I like the combo, because I do want a God who has the power to defeat sin and death AND who can relate to our skinned knees and broken hearts. I want a God who creates the cosmos and is mindful of the sparrows. I want a God who can hold us when we cry and is working to bring an end to mourning, crying, pain, and death. We need God to be the God revealed to us in Jesus and through the Holy Spirit.

Each time we pray our Lord's Prayer, we are witnessing to and reminding ourselves that God is all this and so much more - and that God takes each one of us just as we are - confusing (hot) messes of saints and sinners; fragile and beautiful; already and notyet the ones God created us to be.

Children of God – brother and sister in Christ – blessings be upon your praying and living.

Members present: Gary Botner, Kathy Hoefs, Diane Kracht, Brenda Laub, Robert Nelson, Glen Torgerson, Kim Wittenberg, Kaneia Kinney (Treas), and Pastor Diane.

President Diane Kracht called the meeting to order, and Pastor Diane led devotions. Thank you notes were read from Computer Express thanking Trinity for the business and from Max Magnuson for receiving the W. Erickson Scholarship. The agenda and previous council minutes were approved, and the treasurer's report was received.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Christian Education/Youth – Diane: Sunday School began with Rally Sunday, September 14. Students helped with worship and assembling school kits. We have 9 students registered from age 5 through grade 6. Parent-Student Confirmation meeting was held on Sept 10; classes begin Sept 17. Trinity has 10 students for grades 7-9. Senior High Youth Group at OSLC resumes Sept 17th for Grades 10-12. Senior High Lunches at OSLC are on Fridays. Faith Kids Club (Grades 4-6) has resumed. Next Meeting – Tuesday, October 7th at 4:45pm.

Yehiel Curry to Be Installed as ELCA Presiding Bishop

CHICAGO (Sept. 26, 2025) — The Rev. Yehiel Curry will be installed as presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA) on Saturday, Oct. 4, at 2 p.m. Central time at Central Lutheran Church in Minneapolis, MN. Curry will be the first Black presiding bishop of the ELCA.

ELCA Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton will preside at the installation and present Curry with the pectoral cross, the common symbol of the office of bishop in the ELCA.

The Rev. Kevin Vandiver, senior pastor of Lutheran Church of the Reformation in Washington, D.C., will deliver the sermon. Members of the ELCA Conference of Bishops and other invited leaders will participate in the processional.

In celebration of the ELCA's many partnerships, several ecumenical, interreligious and global partner representatives are invited, including the Rev. Henrik Stubkjaer, president of the Lutheran World Federation; the Most Rev. Sean Rowe, presiding bishop of The Episcopal Church; the Rev. Jihyun Oh, stated clerk of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.); and the Rev. Larry Kochendorfer, presiding bishop of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada.

Music leadership for the worship service includes the National Lutheran Choir and musicians from St. Olaf College and the ELCA Metropolitan Chicago Synod.

The installation is a public worship service, open to all who wish to attend. The service will also be available via livestream.

Curry was elected to serve a six-year term as presiding bishop on July 30, during the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix. He has served as bishop of the Metropolitan Chicago Synod since 2019 and previously served as mission developer (2009-2012) and pastor (2012-2019) of Shekinah Chapel in Riverdale, Ill. Curry's first day in office will be Oct. 1.

Curry received a Bachelor of Arts from Lewis University in Romeoville, Ill., in 1995 and a Master of Divinity from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (LSTC) in 2013. LSTC is one of seven ELCA seminaries.
