Trinity Tidings



The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom, and the knowledge of the Holy One is insight.

Proverbs 9:10

This school year, the Small Catechism will be our focus for confirmation classes. So, I thought it might be interesting to share a few "fun" facts about this little book.

- The word "catechism" means a form of instruction using questions and answers.
- Martin Luther wrote the Small Catechism in 1529 for parents to teach their children the basics of the Christian faith. Before Luther, worship services, the Bible, and other books were in Latin a language used by scholars, not common people.
- Luther also wrote "the Large Catechism" (in 1529) for pastors and anyone seeking to go deeper into Christian teachings.
- The invention and use of the Gutenberg Press made it possible for the common person to afford a copy of the Small Catechism. Before this, written materials were copied by hand and were very expensive.
- Because Luther believed that each person could be inspired by the Holy Spirit, he wanted people to have access to Christian teachings and what they mean for daily life. For example, he wanted people to be able to recite the 10 Commandments, understand their meaning, and how to apply them to their lives.
- The Small Catechism can be divided into four main sections: The Ten Commandments, the Creed, the Lord's Prayer, and the Sacraments (Baptism and Communion). The Small Catechism also contains samples of prayers for morning, evening, and mealtimes.
- Luther rediscovered the good news that we are saved by grace through faith in Jesus Christ. Equally as important to him was how we responded to this good news. In other words, he hoped people would trust in God's mercy to save them AND they would live as people who have been freely given God's love.
- The Small Catechism is printed in the Evangelical Lutheran Worship hymnal (cranberry), pages 1160-1167.

If you have not had the opportunity to read the Small Catechism or if it has been awhile, I encourage you to take a look. I invite you to reflect on how you would answer the question "What does this mean?" – what does faith in Jesus mean to you and how does it shape your daily life?

President Diane Kracht called the meeting to order, and Pastor Diane led devotions. A thank you note was read from Kathy Langemo thanking the congregation for caring for her mom, Ethel Heckman. The agenda and previous council minutes were approved, and the treasurer's report was received.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Christian Education/Youth – Diane: Sunday School will begin with Rally Sunday, Sept 14. Thank you to the people who volunteered to teach, help, and/or sub. Confirmation classes will resume Sept 10th with a Parent-Student Meeting, and classes will begin the following week. We will again work with Faith and Our Savior's – rotating among the 3 locations. Senior High Youth Group at OSLC resumes Sept 17th for Grades 10-12. Faith Kids Club (Grades 4-6) resumes September 3. Next Meeting – Tuesday, September 30th at 4:45pm.

Endowment – Glen: Next meeting: September 21st after church.

Global Missions/Outreach/Stewardship – Brenda: Trinity hosted a Neighborhood Party on July 23rd – serving hamburgers and Bumpa's Ice Cream. About 35 people attended with 9 neighbors. We are close to the goal of making 80 school kits in celebration of Lutheran World Relief's 80th Anniversary. Kits will be assembled on Rally Sunday. Next Meeting: TBD.

Worship – Kathy: Accompaniment Books were ordered to replace the old ones that are falling apart. Approximate cost of \$75. We discussed the feasibility of projecting the worship service on a screen – having someone create the PowerPoint and run it during services will be challenging.
