Trinity Tidings



"The sun's light failed, and the curtain of the temple was torn in two." Luke 23:45

If the walls of your home could speak, what stories would they tell? Newborn babies crying through the night? Family gathering around the table for holidays? Who broke mother's favorite bowl and how?

What about the walls of the temple in Jerusalem? What stories would they tell us?

There are many stories of Jesus being at the Temple in Jerusalem during his earthly life. As a baby, he was brought to the Temple to be presented to the Lord. When Jesus was 12 years old, he visited with the teachers at his "Father's house" (Luke 2). The devil took Jesus to the top of the temple and dared him to jump (Luke 4). Jesus taught and healed in the courtyards of the Temple and drove out the money changers (Luke 18-21).

It is hard to overstate how important the Temple was to the Jews of Jesus' day. God was said to dwell in the Holy of Holies room – in the darkness, behind a massive curtain. The courtyards were arranged to speak of the degrees of holiness that were assigned to people. The more holy were allowed closer access to God. The High Priest could enter the Holy of Holies once a year – after that the priests could get the closest, then Jewish men, next Jewish women, and finally Gentiles (non-Jews).

On Palm Sunday, the Sunday School students will display a Lego model they have built of the Temple of Jesus' day. The Lego brick walls speak to us of how radical Jesus' message is to the world. Jesus is Emmanuel, "God with us" – not "God separated from us." They speak of how radical our calling is to reach beyond humanmade walls that divide us. Throughout his earthly ministry, Jesus crossed religious and social barriers to reach out to all people. At the time of his death on the cross, the curtain behind which God was believed to dwell was torn in two. God was on the loose. Out of the building and on the move.

As we approach Good Friday and Easter Sunday, we remember that Christ has torn down every barrier – not even death can separate us from God's love. Jesus' life, death, and resurrection has taken down the walls between us and God and between us and other people. So, let's do the speaking of this Good News – and not leave it just up to the walls to tell.

The meeting was called to order. Pastor Diane led devotions from Genesis 15. The council received thank you cards from APOC and from Rochelle. The council also received and approved a request from Kellen Westman regarding an Eagle Scout Project. The agenda and February meeting minutes were approved. The treasurer's report was received. It was suggested and approved that, in the newsletter, the beginning and ending balance of the bank statement for the previous month, the month's expenses and income, and the amount of outstanding checks will be given.
