Trinity Tidings



By his great mercy he has given us a new birth into a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead. I Peter 1:3b

Alleluia! Christ is risen! He is risen indeed! Alleluia!

We are in the midst of seven Sundays of celebrating the resurrection of our Lord. We culminate our celebration on Pentecost Sunday (June 8) with the giving of the Holy Spirit and the disciples being sent to spread the good news to the ends of the earth.

After the somber mood of Lent, Easter Sunday greets us with the joy of new life. We sing alleluia – which means "Praise the Lord!" We behold beautiful flowers and weekly partake of Christ's presence in the bread and wine. We even have a silly Sunday of laughter (April 27). What good news we hear! What great hope we have because Jesus lives!

Of course, on this side of eternity, our joy has not reached its completion. We still need to do the laundry, cut the grass, and do other daily tasks. We still experience the ups and downs of life. However, our day-to-day life does not diminish the power of the resurrection. In fact, it changes how we understand existence.

There is a story that has appeared in various versions. One is of a young girl who found a cocoon in her backyard. Day after day, she checked on it. Finally, one day, a small opening appeared. She returned several times during the day to watch the progress. Hours passed, and the butterfly was still struggling to squeeze its body through the small opening. She thought she might be able to help, so she used a scissors to open the cocoon. The butterfly emerged, but its body was swollen and its wings small and wrinkled. The girl waited for the butterfly's wings to expand and the butterfly to fly off. But that never happened. It was necessary for the butterfly to squeeze through the small opening to force the fluid from its body to its wings.

Sometimes, our challenges are part of the process of God leading us to something new. Just as Jesus endured the cross before his resurrection, God can use our difficult times to strengthen us and prepare us for what is to come.

As we think of the butterfly struggling out of its cocoon, we have an advantage. We know Jesus is risen and we shall arise. We know, one day, we will emerge to the fulness of new life and take flight. We know that even in our most ordinary of moments our Lord offers us joy, hope, and life.

CROP Hunger Walk: Wed., May 7 7 p.m., beginning @ Jefferson School 1150 Central Ave. N., Valley City

The 45th Annual Valley City CROP Walk for Hunger will be on Wednesday, May 7th at 7 p.m., on the Jefferson Elementary School Mile. This year's theme is "Chickens, Beans, and Big Dreams." Seventy-five percent of the funds raised will go to fight hunger around the world and 25% will stay in our local community (Barnes County Food Pantry, the Hi-Liner Food Pantry at Valley City Public Junior/Senior High, and the Valley City State University Food Pantry.) Last year more than \$5,240 was raised.

CROP Hunger Walk is a nationwide movement sponsored by Church World Service – with over 500 communities participating across the United States. CROP Hunger Walks are a way to respond to the global challenges of hunger and poverty in the US and around the world. Your participation helps transform communities by ensuring access to nutritious food, giving kids a chance at a good education, and increasing availability of clean water for drinking and hygiene. Valley City's participation in this event started in 1981 with the help of the late Rev. Wayne McKirdy.

Come on May 4th – learn more at booths stationed throughout the Jefferson School Mile. Be sure to check out Trinity's booth: Latrine Bean Bag Toss. Begin your walk by registering at the table by the school. A brief educational experience will be shared by the school at 7 p.m. Donations can be given at the event or dropped off at TLC office until noon on May 7th. TRINITY COUNCIL MEETING - Highlights from April 8, 2025

Members present: Gary Botner, Kathy Hoefs, Diane Kracht, Brenda Laub, Robert Nelson, Glen Torgerson, Kaneia Kinney (Treas), and Pastor Diane. Absent: Kim Wittenberg

President Diane Kracht called the meeting to order. Pastor Diane led devotions. Thank you notes were read from Naomi for the plant and gift card and from Lutheran Disaster Response for the \$1,164 donation for the fires in California. The agenda and March council minutes were approved, and the treasurer's report was received.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

Christian Education/Youth – Diane: Youth-led Sunday will be Apr 27. Sunday School students are greeting, ushering, and writing/saying the prayers. They will have a short program with the theme of "Be the Light." Confirmation Students will be lesson readers. Graduate Recognition on May 4. We still need pictures and plans from graduates. May 4th is also the last day of Sunday School. Bumpa's Ice Cream Truck will be available. Confirmation Classes resume after Lent (at Trinity on Apr 23 & 30) and will participate in CROP WALK on May 7. The committee will be considering options for Sunday School next year. Next Meeting – Thursday, May 15th at 4:45pm.

Endowment – Glen: Endowment voted to cover the cost for Trinity members attending Red Willow Bible Camp & Castaway Retreat and Trinity's share of VBS costs. Endowment voted to reimburse Trinity members for the cost of the bus ride to EaND SWO's Roundup in April at Stump Lake \$30/seat (with a maximum of \$300). Next meeting: September 21st after church.

Global Missions/Outreach/Stewardship – Brenda: Trinity will be helping with Crop Walk (May 7th) and doing Easter crafts with Open Door. Next Meeting: Thursday, May 8th at 5pm.

Worship – Kathy: Accompanist Schedule was updated. Plans were finalized for Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, Easter services, and Youth-led Sunday/Holy Humor Sunday. Beginning plans for "Christmas in July" for July 20th. Next Meeting: Wednesday, May 28th at 2pm.

Women (WELCA) – *Kim Wittenberg submitted report*: Thank you to the men who served the Lent Supper on March 26th. Next meeting: Apr 15th at Noon.

Property – Gary & Robert: Robert is following up on an issue with a noisy motor on the church boiler. Concerns over the temperature in the Church Boiler Room are being looked into. The Elevator Call Button update is paid for, and work will be done later. Gary will arrange for repairs on the sidewalk on the north side of the church.

OLD BUSINESS:

The Coffee Hour offering designated to Elevator Update will continue through May. Church Computers – New, better anti-virus software was installed on the current computers, and they were "cleaned up". Working better. We have not yet received an estimate to replace two church computers (they will become obsolete in October). Annuity matured in March. \$25,000 will be invested in annuity for 3 years at 5%, \$25,000 will be invested in a short-term CD, and the remaining will go into the General Fund (approximately \$2,000). Church Musician Appreciation Sunday, *Administration Professional Day, and Financial Secretary Day* went well on March 30.

There was no new business. The meeting was adjourned and closed with the Lord's Prayer. The next council meeting will be Tuesday, June 10th at 6:30pm.

Members of the E.L.C.A.: Evangelical Lutheran Church in America Trinity's Mission "Love God...Love Others"

A brief council meeting was held on April 27, 2025, following worship services. Trinity received \$122,32.21 gift from the Harold Pross Estate. Motion, seconded, carried to invest \$50,000 with Valley Wealth Advisors, \$50,000 in a 7-month CD, and deposit the remaining in the General Fund (designated for special projects).
