In just over a week our Lenten season turns to Holy Week and the Great Three Days. This week and these three days especially are at the heart of the liturgical year and the center of our Christian faith. From the opening *hosannas* on Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday to hearing Christ's new commandment around the table and in the context footwashing to Jesus' triumphal reigning from the cross proclaimed in John's Gospel to the proclamation of *Christ is risen* during this week

and through these three days we enter the paschal mystery once again moving us from death into life.

Holy Week begins with Sunday of the Passion/Palm Sunday. This day bears the weight of telling two stories. In the *gathering rite* we hear the processional gospel, from Matthew, Mark, or Luke depending on the lectionary year, that tells of Jesus' entry into Jerusalem as a gathering of people waved palm branches and shouted *hosanna!* After the *Prayer of the Day* the readings turn to focus on Jesus' passion and death. The *First Reading, Psalm, and Epistle* are the same this Sunday each year, while the *Gospel Reading* is the passion story from Matthew, Mark, or Luke according to the lectionary year. The lectionary gives us this day to hear the passion account from one of the synoptic gospels, which place an emphasis on Jesus' suffering and abandonment. This two-fold focus on this Sunday sets the tone for entering Holy Week and the Great Three Days.

The services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and the Easter Vigil or Easter Day are one continuous service over multiple days. You may have noticed there is no blessing at the end of the Maundy Thursday and Good Friday services that brings them to a conclusion.

The Great Three Days or The Triduum open with Maundy Thursday. On this night the service begins with an extended ritual of absolution including the laying on of hands. This extended absolution is offered as a bookend to the extended confession of sin made on Ash Wednesday. This service tells of the Passover meal shared by ancient Israel and the Passover meal Christ shares with his disciples. However, in John 13, the focus at the supper is not the food but the footwashing and Jesus' demonstrating the new commandment he is about to give his disciples. After we share in our Lord's holy supper the chancel area is stripped. This is an opportunity to think of the Church's sorrow over Christ's death and our own paring down to receive the life of Christ.

Good Friday is the starkest and simplest of these services. Here the focus is on the passion from the Gospel of John that proclaims Christ reigning in glory from the cross and drawing all creation into the heart and mercy of God. Gathered around the cross, using the *Bidding Prayer* we pray for everyone and all creation through a series of bids, silent prayer, and summery collects.

The culmination of the Great Three Days with resurrection jubilation, proclaims that while earthly powers have done their worst, God's power to bring life even from death's stone-shut tomb is greater. Easter is not merely a day but a season. Sunday to the year this festival time of 50 days has been called for it is a week of weeks (seven weeks concluding with the Day of Pentecost). This is also the time in the church year when we read from the book of Acts and consider again like those early believers how to make sense of life in light of the resurrection of Christ and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit.

These services are not meant to be reenactments of past events, but ritual observances that center us again in the paschal mystery of our faith that ushes us from death into life. Each service is in its own way a proclamation of Christ crucified and risen for the life of the world.
