This will be a sign for you: you will find a child wrapped in bands of cloth and lying in a manger. Luke 2:12

Are you sneaky? Especially at Christmas time? I have done a few "sneaky" things. I have wrapped a very small gift in a very big box. I have wrapped a small box with clues to where the real present is hidden. I have even said I was heading to one place, and then I made multiple stops in search of just the right gift. Perhaps you have been part of some type of "sneaky" Christmas maneuver.

Such activities are fun with the goal of surprising and delighting the receiver with a special gift. It is a way to show others how much they mean to us because we have taken the time to pull off such elaborate schemes.

However, this can also be a "sneaky" time of year because the big picture can get lost. We know "Jesus is the reason for the season." But activities, decorations, and gifts can fool us into acting as though these things are more deserving of our time and attention than Jesus.

Christmas is a celebration of the Son of God coming to us in flesh and blood. And for all the cleverness I have tried to use over the years to give that special gift – I know God has me beat when it comes to gifts that surprise and delight. Who else would have thought of wrapping the Savior of the world in a little baby born in Bethlehem? Who else would have left messages through ancient prophets of a not-so-hidden gift being found in Jesus? Who else would let us pray, "Our Father, who art in heaven..." and then always be with us everywhere we go? Who? Of course, it is our loving and imaginative God who wants us to be surprised by His grace and delighted in His presence.

This season I encourage you to reflect on how you can point to Jesus as you engage in any "sneaky" maneuvers – ponder how you can unwrap and reveal Jesus to those you encounter. What gifts can you give that will surprise and delight your receiver with the assurance of Christ's peace? What activities and traditions can be used to strengthen faith? Let your imaginations make use of all your cleverness and faith.

May God bless your Advent preparations and your Christmas celebrations. And may you be surprised and delighted by our Lord coming to us ever anew.
