Trinity Tidings



On the road again...

This is where we meet Jesus in our Sunday readings from Luke over the next several weeks and months as we encounter the kingdom of God coming near to people as Jesus travels from Galilee with his face set toward Jerusalem.

It is not only Jesus who is on the road but his disciples too. And *on the way* he sends seventy (or seventy-two) out in pairs on all kinds of roads to heal the sick and proclaim that the kingdom of God has come near.

Jesus also tells stories in which roads figure prominently like the parable of the Good Samaritan and the Loving Father.

The road Jesus and his followers are on leads decisively to the cross, and this is where this liturgical year will culminate on Christ the King Sunday. Nevertheless, the road does not stop there, but continues from there to the ends of the earth.

While the cross is the focused and determined destination narratively and theologically in this middle section of Luke, the stories are about what happens *on the way*, in light of Jesus' death and resurrection. More than focusing on the starting point or the destination, these stories give us encounters the kingdom of God coming near to people and in places in surprising and unexpected ways.

The parable of the Good Samaritan centers on what happens on the road, on the way. It is Jesus' answer to a lawyer's question about setting parameters on who one's neighbor is. Instead of legalese, Jesus tells a story and invites the lawyer to answer his own question but with a twist. It is no longer who is my neighbor? but who was a neighbor?

Sometimes I think we can get preoccupied with destinations and miss the journey *on the way.* In our hurried and busy lives, we can miss the kingdom of God breaking in and coming near to us *on the road.* In our distraction we can miss the neighbors who cry out for help and who show up in surprising ways to help us in our need.

Jesus' travel on the road is also full of banquets and stories of grand celebrations and feasts as when the lost are found in Luke 15. This is the feast we celebrate *on the way* in the holy meal that connects all our table gatherings from dining rooms to board rooms, from coffee shops to classrooms.

Whatever road you find yourself on and the road we travel together as a community of faith let us be attentive for God's kingdom coming near to us *on the way* and ever ready for a banquet celebration when the lost are found.

The glory and wonder are not in the destination, the arrival, but in the manifestation of God's kingdom coming near to us, here and now, on the way and on the road. May this grace keep our hearts open to love every neighbor and all creation as we have been loved by God.

The road we are on is the one of baptismal living and its end is Jesus Christ.


