⁶So when they had come together, they asked him, "Lord, is this the time when you will restore the kingdom to Israel?" ⁷He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or periods that the Father has set by his own authority. ⁸But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the

earth." ⁹When he had said this, as they were watching, he was lifted up, and a cloud took him out of their sight. ¹⁰While he was going and they were gazing up toward heaven, suddenly two men in white robes stood by them. ¹¹They said, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven? This Jesus, who has been taken up from you into heaven, will come in the same way as you saw him go into heaven."

Acts 1:6-11

The passage is from the last half of the Acts reading appointed for Ascension Day. Most congregations don't have Ascension Day services, though some may substitute these readings on the following Sunday (Seventh Sunday of Easter). However, for my first 10 years in ministry I served a congregation about an hour away from Augustana College in Rock Island, IL. This college of our church has a Chapel which is located on one of the bluffs on the campus overlooking the Mississippi River. The Chapel is also on the second floor of this building and after walking the sidewalk steps and inside stairs ascending all the way one can feel in part why it is named Ascension Chapel.

Every year on Ascension Day, a Thursday in mid to late May, the college would host an Ascension Day service, breakfast, and often a speaker. I always enjoyed these services and one year was invited to preside. Every year we returned to these same strange readings about this event that for Luke, who wrote the two-volume work we know as Luke-Acts, gets the risen Christ from the confines of earth to the boundless reign at God's right hand.

As we saw on Easter Day with the two men in the tomb who asked the women, "Why do you look for the living among the dead? (Luke 24.__) so now in this story it is two men in white robes who address the disciples, "Men of Galilee, why do you stand looking up toward heaven?" Over the years of going to those Ascension Day services I heard many preachers marvel and wonder about Jesus' dangling feet and the disciples looking up at them.

It is quite an image to imagine in our mind. But like at the empty tomb, so now, I believe the question is meant to redirect our attention. Why are we looking up, when indeed, we called and sent to be looking out into the world? This is where we will see and encounter Jesus.

It is a challenge to look out in our world today that is ripped by injustice and oppression, war and hunger, power and greed. But this is why we have one another in this meal-centered community of faith that connects our Lord's table to every table where we gather from kitchens and cafes to board-rooms and backyards with the abundant grace and reconciling love of Christ.

Ascension Day is May 26th this year. I invite you into the absurd wonder and awe of this mystery and celebration. And don't strain your neck looking up, but look out, look around you for the risen Christ to accompany you, surprise you, and continue turning fear into joy, apprehension into active love, and impossibility into trust and hope.
