During the last week of June, Faith, Our Savior's, and Trinity Lutheran Congregations hosted Vacation Bible School. It was two and half days packed with music, activities, and games – as we reflected on

our Triune God - Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. Students in grades 1-6 were led by four camp counselors from Red Willow Bible Camp and a host of local volunteers. Pre-K and Kindergarten children were taught by local volunteers. A HUGE thank you to Rebecca Westman, Tessa Kinney, and Kellen Westman for volunteering from Trinity Lutheran.

On the day we focused on the Spirit, we used animal tracks to think about how to look for God's Spirit helping us. We looked at different pictures of animal tracks and talked about a few key differences between cat, dog, chicken, deer, rabbit, bear, and people tracks. And we reflected on how animal tracks tell us that an animal has been by and what kind of animal it is. We might not have seen the animal, but we know that it was there because it left its mark. In a similar way, the Holy Spirit is not something we can see or touch – but the Spirit leaves behind tracks - tracks of love. When we see or hear of people being supported or helped, we see tracks of love and know that God has been there. And even when we are having a bad day, God is still with us and we are to keep looking for tracks of love - because they are there even if we don't see them right away.

St. John writes in I John 4:12 – "No one has ever seen God; if we love one another, God abides in us, and his love is perfected in us."

May we look with curious and trusting eyes for God's tracks in our lives AND may we leave tracks of God's love on one another's hearts - as we seek to follow in Jesus' footsteps.

SUMMARY of the 2023 EaND SYNOD ASSEMBLY By Pr. Diane Krumm

On June 3-4, 2023, the Eastern North Dakota Synod, ELCA gathered together at the Holiday Inn in Fargo, ND for the thirty-sixth annual Synod Assembly under the theme of "Equip." There were a total of 293 people in attendance (176 Lay Voting Members; 85 Rostered Minister Voting Members; 32 Visitors).

The business items included hearing reports from officers, adopting the 2025 Synod Mission Plan (budget), election of a new Synod Vice President (Dr. Elna Solvang), elections for Synod Council positions and committees, and adopting four resolutions (some were amended). Participants also heard the State of the Synod from Bishop Tessa Moon Leiseth and State of the ELCA from our churchwide representative, Rev. Lamont Wells.

We had two uplifting worship services with an emphasis on our Outdoor Ministries and Campus Ministries at Opening Worship and installation of our Synod Vice President at Closing Worship.

There were three workshop sessions with a total of ten different options. Three Equip Experiences included learning about and practicing FAITH5 with Pr. Amy Kippen, a Hand-Stretching Exercise by our Portico Representative, and Lectio Divina with Bishop Tessa.

Rostered Ministers and Congregations celebrating significant anniversaries were acknowledged, along with naming the congregations that have experienced Holy Closure in the past year.

A "Food for All Block Party" was held at Bethlehem Lutheran Church on Saturday evening where financial gifts and food donations were collected for food ministries across the synod. A total of \$3550 was raised.

- 1. Christian Education & Youth Jennifer:

6. Property/Gene, Bruce & Stan -

CHURCH: Sidewalk: Bruce will follow up with the gas company.

Roof leak: may have been due to the major downpour; property members will keep an eye on it.

Insurance: Grinnell Insurance will no longer insure buildings older than 1950; Dacotah will transfer our insurance to a new company.

PARSONAGE: There was a leak in the boiler line, which led to a call from the city letting us know that we were losing 4 gallons of water an hour. Bruce will talk to Keith's about getting a bid to run a line through the ceiling instead of tearing up the cement to fix it. He will also follow up on the vents to the parsonage basement.
