Trinity Tidings



Jesus replied, "It is not for you to know ... But you will receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you..." Acts 1:6-11

I'm not sure if I like that answer. I know that I am not God and that I cannot understand everything. I can't even begin to imagine God's awesome view of his creation. Still, there are some things that I would like to know.

Last month I participated in a zoom training course on Mental Health First Aid. There were 20 of us – representing a variety of ages and occupations. The instructors did not use fancy words or jargon, as they explained which signs were important to note and how to assist someone who might be experiencing a mental health challenge. Many times, we were reminded that we were being trained to be mental health first aiders. Our job is not to diagnosis or prescribe a treatment plan. We are to be observant and good listeners. When appropriate, we are to offer reassurance and information, and then encourage the person to seek out appropriate help – while reminding the person that they are not alone.

To my surprise, I found it refreshing to be instructed that it was not my job to know it all. I didn't have to explain how the brain works or define the latest term in a diagnostic manual. I had permission to be a caring person who helped the person get help. I could just be me, and the individual could just be a person – not a diagnosis or a label.

On the 40th day after the first Easter Sunday, Jesus ascended into heaven. He left the disciples with a lot of unanswered questions and a lot of permission to not be God. They just needed to be who they were created and called to be as followers of Christ (and that is enough of challenge for any of us). And, most importantly, they were not alone. It was possible to be at peace with not knowing "what", when they knew "who." They knew who would be with them – Jesus was sending the Holy Spirit.

I heard a bit of the Ascension story message in the Mental Health First Aid training. I could be at peace not knowing all the answers to the "what" questions (including what was the person's diagnosis), because I knew the answer to "who." I would offer assistance. And as a Christian, I would trust that the Holy Spirit would help me be Jesus' voice and presence for this person. We would not be alone.

I invite you to consider being trained as a Mental Health First Aider. There is information about the course in this newsletter. And I invite you to lean into the "who" when we don't have all the answers – trusting the Holy Spirit to give us peace that is beyond our understanding.


