"Such knowledge is too wonderful for me; it is so high that I cannot attain it." Psalm 139:6

Do you remember your first day of classes for a new school year? Do you remember watching your child walk into the school building and feeling the joy and sadness of a new chapter in their life beginning?

When I was in college, the first week of a semester was stressful for me. Some of it was simply beginning a new routine, finding the right classrooms, and meeting different professors. But mostly, looking at each syllabus from each class and thinking to myself, "How will I ever learn that much and do all those things in 3 months?" I quickly learned to divide up the work for what I needed to do each week and pace myself.

In Psalm 139, we hear about our God knowing us very well. God knows where we have been and were we are. God knows our thoughts before we voice them. God knows us so well because God created us – knit us together in our mothers' wombs, and we are "fearfully and wonderfully made." (v. 13-14)

I am sure God knew that I was stressed as classes began. I think God smiled when I took a deep breath, said a prayer, and plotted out the work for the semester. I wonder if God didn't think something like, "Yep, I knew you would get there."

Some of the things I have learned in my life have been in a classroom setting, but not all of them. Sometimes, I have had to relearn things or unlearn them. But I don't think any of us can fully comprehend the marvelous mystery of having a God who chooses to never abandon us - who loves us so much that we are never alone. It really is knowledge that is too wonderful for us to grasp.

As this school year begins, let us pray with thanksgiving for students, teachers, staff, parents, and guardians and ask for safe environments that will help them grow. Let also pray that all of us may rest in the assurance that God is always with us and, when we are too stressed by the big picture, that God will help us to take a deep breath and focus on what we need to do today.

Another two boxes of Bible that were in good condition were collected and given to Orphan Grain Train and to local congregations for distribution. Prayers of blessings were offered for these Bibles and those who will be receiving them.
