"...we have this treasure in clay jars, so that it may be made clear that this extraordinary power belongs to God..." II Corinthians 4:7

I remember watching TV shows where the hero wore a white hat and the villain twirled a moustache. In these shows, the heroes were above reproach and always won in the end. The villains always lost - often because of their own greed or pride. There was something comforting about these shows. I knew who was who and what to expect from them. And I could rest assured that good would somehow triumph over evil. While I may wish for all people to be as easily categorized as the characters in these TV shows, I know they are not. We are imperfect people living in an imperfect world. So, too, were the people in the Bible.

Our theme for this Lent is "Turning the World Around: Bible Anti-Heroes and Villains." We will meet a few anti-heroes in the Bible people who do not fit the stereotype of heroes - perhaps because they engaged in some questionable acts or were lacking in a few virtues. And we will hear about at least one character who is downright despicable. In their stories, we will see God at work turning the world around.

In his letters to the church at Corinth, Paul was challenging the notion that certain people were better Christians because of their ability to speak in tongues or experience visions. In fact, Paul said that God's power is often more clearly seen when we are weak. We are like clay jars - fragile, chipped, cracked. Yet God chooses to pour into his people the treasures of his mercy and justice. What flows from us, then, is not our greatness, but God's. The power of our words and actions come from God, not us. God is turning the world around. Making what is weak, strong. Wise, foolish. Despised, precious. And bringing to destruction the forces that seek to destroy God's creation.

As we journey through Lent and come to Christ on the cross, we see most clearly how God turns the world around – turning death into life. Along the way, we will encounter Jael, Leah, Nicodemus, Satan, and others. Through them, we will discover that, because the power does belong to God, we can see ourselves, one another, and the world in the way that God does, and we can rest assured that good has and will triumph over evil.

A Visit to the Border: A Humanitarian Crisis

On Thursday, Feb. 1 at 7 pm, Nancy Farnham will present "A Visit to the Border: A Humanitarian Crisis" at the Barnes County Museum on Central Avenue in Valley City. The presentation is free, and co-sponsored by *What in the World Is Going On?* and the Barnes Co. Historical Society.

The Mexico-U.S. border is in the news daily. Attendees of this talk and powerpoint will be able to hear first hand from Farnham what the situation is like at the border. She will share information about what she saw and heard while at the border, including her experience at shelters in Mexico, visits with local people who live and work along the border wall, and the people she met at the wall who had just crossed into the U.S.

Farnham decided to go on this trip, which took place Oct. 24-30, 2023, because there is so much in the news about the south border and she wanted to see first-hand what was happening at this time. She had been on a previous border trip in Oct. 2019 which went to El Paso, TX and Juarez MX and was greatly affected by what she saw and heard at that time. She wanted to see what had changed since 2019 and what was happening at a different location along the border.

Farnham travelled to the southern border with a group of 11 people from ND and MN. The ND Eastern Synod of the ELCA and the United Church of Christ Global Justice Advocacy Team organized the trip.

Annual Meeting booklets were distributed at the Annual Meeting (held on Jan. 28) and also emailed to TLC members we have email addresses for, but if you were unable to be at the meeting or prefer a paper copy (rather than email), you may pick one up at the church Monday-Thursday (9 a.m. to 3 p.m.), or on Sunday mornings. They are located on the table just outside the office and also on the table next to the sound system at back of sanctuary. Below are some highlights of the meeting.

Annual Meeting for Year 2023 Highlights

(Congregational meeting held on Sunday, Jan. 28, 2024, following Worship)

- Sound system in sanctuary is fully installed and working well.
- A new Parsonage furnace was successfully installed.
- Going off of council: Gene Langemo, Russ Larson, Jennifer Jenness, and Bruce Anderson. We thank them for their service. Elected to three-year Council terms are Gary Botner and Robert Nelson; elected to one-year Council term is Diane Kracht (completing Bruce Anderson's term).
- Elected to a five-year term for Endowment is Alex Wittenberg (serving second term). Kathy Burchill was elected to complete a term ending in 2028.
- The smaller church boiler was replaced this year. At some point, the larger boiler will need replacing as it is near failing. The church should be proactive and begin planning for its replacement. The TLC Council was given authority to replace the larger boiler, if needed.
- Kitchen countertops in basement: they are showing their age and are cracked in two areas. WELCA received bids for replacement for \$20,000 (from LaValle Flooring) and \$10,600 (from Bob Reierson) for replacing the tops. This will be put on the TLC "Wish list".
- 140th Anniversary of Trinity Lutheran Church: TLC will be 140 years old in 2024. A planning committee will be formed. Aiming for a celebration this fall.
- Synod Assembly delegates: Synod Assembly will take place June 1-2, 2024, in Fargo at the Holiday Inn. Linda Anderson and Jeanne Wobbema were elected to be TLC's voting members for this year.
