Trinity "Tidings"



Lent is the 40-day season (excluding Sundays) of penitence and preparation for the Three Days of Holy Week (Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday) and Easter.

The term "Lent" originally comes from the Anglo-Saxon word "lencten" which means "spring." This is the time, in the Northern Hemisphere, when the days are lengthening. The season began as a period of fasting leading up to the Vigil of Easter. Catechumens, those preparing for baptism at Easter, would fast and spend days in intense preparation. For those that were already baptized, Lent was a period to be renewed in their faith by studying the Bible, the Creed and the Lord's Prayer.

Although it was originally only a 2-day period of preparation, Lent became a 3-week preparatory period in the middle of the fourth century and then this was further expanded into six-weeks, or forty days. By the end of the fifth century, there was a desire to exclude Sundays from Lent since Sundays are always celebrated as feasts of the Resurrection. Thus Lent begins not on Sunday, but on Ash Wednesday.

The current practice of forty days of Lent recall Jesus' forty-day fast in the wilderness after his Baptism (Matthew 4:2, Luke 4:1-2) as well as Moses' forty-day fast on Mount Sinai (Exodus 34:28).

The appointed liturgical **color for Lent is purple** because purple has long been associated with royalty. In this case, Christ reigns from a cross. Currently, the ancient understanding of Lent as both *a time for baptismal preparation* and *baptismal renewal* is being rediscovered in Lutheran rites and practice. (www.elca.org; 3/23/17)

Did you make a New Year's resolution this year? Were you able to keep it for more than a few days or weeks? I've never been big on New Year's resolutions. Maybe it's that the renewing and cleansing waters of baptism give me (and all of us) a new start each week in worship and each day as I/we rise filled with the Holy Spirit and marked with the cross of Christ.

I am thankful that this has nothing to do with how I (or we) feel. If it did, I'd be in serious trouble. I can't say that I rise every morning and greet the new day *feeling* the power of the Spirit driving me to be Christ's presence in the world. Nevertheless, this is the truth for all the baptized, even if *and when* we hit snooze on our alarm clocks.

Lent, like the New Year, offers a time to be intentional about adopting or focusing anew on spiritual practices especially prayer, fasting, and giving. Throughout these forty days we wade through the renewing waters of faith to the ever-flowing waters of new life in Jesus' death and resurrection—the paschal mystery that liberates us from everything that holds us captive.

Lent is the church's preparation for the new year that dawns with Christ's resurrection from the dead. It is the opportunity to prepare for following Christ out from the captivity of the tomb into the world.

The spiritual practices of prayer, fasting, and giving put us deeply in touch with our neighbors near and far. Our prayers become our mission. Our fast connects us to those who hunger and thirst, for food and drink and for justice and peace. Our giving fosters gratitude and generosity that overcomes the entrenched mindset of selfishness and scarcity. Together these practices orientate our lives according the liberating good news of Jesus Christ.

This liberating faith is not merely for us, but also includes a public dimension as we are sent to work for justice and peace in all the earth.

Jim Wallis says, "Don't go right. Don't go left. Go deeper." The season of Lent is the call to go deeper—deeper into the wellspring of baptismal waters, deeper into the practices of our faith, deeper into discipleship and the call to follow the crucified and risen one, for the sake of the world God loves that our faith practices take on a public dimension as we go deeper into the pressing issues of the day.

Going deeper requires growth. Like a seed planted in the ground that dies to what it was and becomes what it is meant to be.

Lent is springtime in the church year when we move from winter's frost to springtime blossoms. The word Lent, in fact, comes from the German word for spring. It is appropriate for this season in the church year is a time of renewal, a time we like the flowers and trees of the earth we are renewed by cleansing waters, and nurtured by the spiritual disciplines of prayer, fasting, and giving. God brings about new growth, new life in us as we prepare for the Great Three Days and the flowing waters of Easter.
