When the day of Pentecost had come... Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among Acts 2:1-21 them...

I have a friend whose son asks the most interesting questions. For example, one day, when he was 11 years old, he asked me what I thought would happen if he held a candle under a ping pong ball. I guessed it would heat the air inside the ball and pop it. Wrong. He took me to the backyard, put a ping pong ball on an old stump, and held a flame to it. The ball caught fire and burned – for quite a while with quite a high flame. He and I stood watching in wonder before I began asking a few questions of my own. Such as "What made you think of putting flame to a ping pong ball? Have you done this before? What else have you torched lately?"

Don't worry. He did not grow up to be an arsonist. He is a mechanical engineer. His curiosity and desire to experiment are important to his work. (But please don't try his idea.)

On May 28, we celebrate the Day of Pentecost – the 50th day after Easter Sunday. God's Spirit came upon the disciples with the rush of a mighty wind and tongues of fire on each person's head. They began to speak in other languages so that everyone in Jerusalem could understand that Jesus is the risen and living Son of God. The flame that rested upon them is with us as well.

Curiosity and the desire to experiment are important to our holy work of sharing God's grace and love. We can and should ask those "What would happen if..." questions. What would happen if we tried something new; reached beyond our comfort zone; embraced someone who is different from us; stopped and really listened to someone; or shared how deeply vital our faith is to us? Would we pop? Or would we shine?

It doesn't take a tree stump to answer this. But it did take a tree – a cross – and Jesus dying and rising to new life. We are Easter people – redeemed and resurrected. We are Pentecost people – set on fire to share the good news of Jesus. May we burn brightly and forever with the passion and compassion of our Lord. And may we be bold to ask questions and partake in holy experiments.

CASAFE

Trinity members recently welcomed visitors Patti Sue Arnold, creator and CEO of Casa de Fe in Shell, Ecuador, and her son John Paul. They were joined by Jeff and Rae Holte, Cormorant Lutheran, Lake Pake, MN, who recently returned to the US

after spending the past four years as missionaries at Casa de Fe. Following a luncheon hosted and prepared by Trinity members, the visitors presented an update on Casa de Fe.

Patti Sue extended heartfelt thanks to Trinity, its members and the Valley City community for their continued support of Casa de Fe. Casa de Fe is going strong caring for 45 children at this time. It is continuing its mission to provide for underprivileged children of Shell, Ecuador, and the Amazon region by meeting their physical, educational, medical, and most importantly, their spiritual needs.

Currently, Casa de Fe has two important financial needs: a permanent residence on the Casa de Fe grounds for the special needs individuals and a bus to provide transportation to school for special needs students. There is still no physical therapist on staff. The only therapy is provided by visiting/traveling missionary therapists.

There have been changes at Casa de Fe. School-aged children now attend the public schools allowing the former school on campus to be renovated and used as guest quarters for visiting mission teams. A shelter has been added to the children's play area which provides shade and protection from the daily rains.

Those in attendance agreed it is always encouraging to hear first hand about the good that the monies raised at Trinity's Casa de Fe fundraisers provide. It is truly worth all of our efforts at Trinity!
